Greetings! The reason why we are focusing on security is that one of our communities experienced a robbery some months back and so even though we work in a quieter environment (rural setting) we have decided, as a precautionary measure, to tighten our own security. Due to the economic woes our country has been going through for the past ten years there has been an increase in criminal activities especially among the youths mainly because over 80% are not gainfully employed.

On the issue you proposed of linking up our young ones with the kids in your parish I am wondering if doing it through the post would be helpful in the initial stages of the exchange. I am saying so because our young ones here, even though they are excited about the whole idea they have neither access to the internet nor computers. Possibly for Hannah, the child who will link up with her might, in addition to sending letters written in her own handwriting, use my computer in the meantime.

We are very busy here this week, we have a total of 250 youths who have come for their annual retreat from across the diocese. The retreat runs until Friday.
